# Thought for the Week - Sabbath Rest by Sheila White

The Sabbath principle was introduced right at the beginning of creation, before the Law was given and it is still relevant today. It became part of the Law and Jesus was famous for breaking it in the eyes of the scribes and Pharisees. However He did not discard it but said 'the Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath' (Matthew 12:7). In other words, it is for our benefit but we are not meant to keep it in a legalistic way.

The main purpose of the Sabbath is REST. God did not need to rest after creating the universe but he was establishing a principle for man to follow. The Biblical Sabbath is from Friday sunset to Saturday sunset and this is still observed by Jews and some Christians around the world. It is a day when man rests from his work and gathers with family to celebrate God's creation. There is no doubt that resting every seventh day is beneficial to our body and soul. Interestingly there is no command to 'go to church' on the Sabbath. This idea probably comes from the instruction under the Law to 'keep it holy' meaning set apart, special, different from the other day.

It's very easy to let this principle of REST slip in our lives. I have recently discovered the danger of it in my own situation. It's no good continuing to ask the Lord for strength for each day if we don't obey the Sabbath principle! For some of us it is hard to draw a line between work and rest, especially if we are retired from 'normal' work. For some of us Sunday morning church is work. For housewives it's even more difficult as we tend to have work to do every day. Some friends once met a monk who was about to go on holiday and they asked him what work he would rest from. The answer was – prayer! The fact is we all need a day of complete rest from whatever our labours may be – not a half day or an occasional break but one full day per week. For those of us who like working, this is a discipline we must develop and be accountable. I don't think we have to adhere to Saturday as our Sabbath, indeed some of us cannot, but it is good to designate a day and to let others know what your 'day off' is so that they can respect it.

We all know that Andy's day off is Monday. It may be helpful to know that Alex's days off are Thursday and Saturday; Naomi does not work for SBC on Tuesday or Thursday; Richard only works mornings Monday to Friday and Judith's SBC work days are Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday. As for myself, I am not available Monday or Thursday but being 'retired' and voluntary means I can choose to have days off when I like!
